CHECKLIST OF ITEMS TO ASSEMBLE BEFORE THE HURRICANE

Remember, if you stay in your own home during the hurricane and it was not damaged, you could be without 1) electricity, 2) gas, 3) water and 4) sewer service for several days.

PLAN AHEAD

- 1. Each person needs a minimum of one gallon of water a day.
- 2. Obtain a week's supply of nonperishable foods (canned goods meat, tuna fish, vegetables, baked beans, peanut butter, jelly, soups, boxes of crackers, cereal, bread, etc.)
 - a. Purchase a non-electric can opener.
 - b. Most foods will have to be eaten cold; normal appliances may not work.
 - c. Plan to eat your frozen foods in advance with no electricity, you have no refrigerator or freezer and items will spoil.
- 3. Medicines you need for at least a week.
- 4. Special dietary and baby foods.
- 5. Personal care items and toilet paper.
- 6. First aid supplies (bandages, antiseptic solution).
- 7. Blankets.
- 8. Candles with matches or lighter.
- 9. Flashlight with extra batteries.
- 10. Portable battery operated radio (to listen for important information broadcast during the storm.)
- 11. Place important papers (wills, living wills, insurance policies and doctors orders) in a secure waterproof container.
- 12. Have your car ready check gas, oil and water.

ATTACHMENT 4 (FOR RESIDENTS)

EVACUATION ROUTES AND SHELTER LOCATIONS

If in the event an order to evacuate is given, the following properties should use the transportation routes listed below. If you need shelter, please go to the appropriate shelter listed below.

Projects FL 20-1, Citrus Court, FL 20-7A, Mims:

Evacuate west on State Road 46. If shelter is required, the public shelter is located at Pinewood Elementary school on Lionel Road.

FL20-5, Hopkins Place, Lincoln and Roosevelt, Project 20-8, Baxley Manor, Merritt Island:

Evacuate west on State Road 528. If shelter is required, the public shelter is located at Brevard Community College Cocoa Campus on Clearlake Road.

Projects FL19-1, Barlow Homes, FL19-2, Peter Young, FL19-3 Peachtree Manor, FL19-4, Brockington Homes, FL19-5, Pineda/Moore Homes, Cocoa:

Evacuate west on State Road 520. If shelter is required, shelter is located at Anderson Elementary School on south Fiske Blvd.

Projects FL56-2, Temple Terrace, FL56-5, Mathers Street, FL20-6, Tucker Heights FL20-7E, Arthur Circle, Melbourne:

Evacuate to Interstate 95. If shelter is required, the public shelter is located at Brevard Community College Melbourne Campus on Wickham Road.

Projects FL56-1, Booker Heights, FL56-3, Elliot Newell Court, FL56-5, Mitchell and Hickory Streets, FL20-5, Hopkins Place, FL20-7E, Monroe, Randolph, Saxon Streets, FL67-1 Ramshur Towers, Melbourne:

Evacuate west on U.S. Highway 192. If shelter is required, the public shelter is located at Eau Gallie High School located on Commodore Blvd.

Project FL20-9 Garden Apartments, Satellite Beach:

Evacuate west on Pineda Causeway then north on Wickham Road to Interstate 95. If shelter is required, the public shelter is located at Brevard Community College Melbourne Campus on Wickham Road.

If you go to a shelter, please bring the following items:

- 1. Bring bottled water, 2 quarts a day per person as well as other beverages, (juices and soft drinks).
- 2. Obtain a week's supply of nonperishable foods (canned goods meat, tuna fish, vegetables, baked beans, peanut butter, jelly, soups, boxes of crackers, cereal, bread, etc.)
- 3. Bring a non-electric can opener, eating utensils, paper plates, cups, and napkins/paper Towels.
- 4. Medicines you need for at least two weeks and First Aid kit
- 5. Any special dietary and baby foods.
- 6. Personal care and hygiene items, diapers, toilet paper, and changes of clothing.
- 7. Cash or Traveler's Checks
- 8. Sleeping bags, blankets, pillows, folding chairs, no bedding is provided in the public shelters.
- 9. Battery powered flashlight and radio/TV, spare batteries, cards, games, books and toys.
- 10. Identification with photo and current address and other important papers, (wills, living wills, insurance policies, doctors' orders).
